I must protest
and complain to the removal of the Sovereign
seal of Dáil Éireann from our Legal
Irish Tender (Bank Notes), by the Central
Bank of Ireland and the Department of Finance.
It is Treason.

The Central Bank of Ireland
and the Department of Finance has no
Right to interfere with the Sovereign seal
of Dáil Éireann or trespass into the
Sovereignty of Dáil Éireann.

The Sovereign seals of
Dáil Éireann are still the Property
of the Irish Republican Brotherhood.

I would like to know how
as Minister for Finance you are going
to compensate the Irish Republican
Brotherhood for the removal of their

Sovereign Seal of Dáil Éireann
from the Irish Legal Tender. The
Irish Bank Notes ???

He did not Place a Harp in the Mansion
House for the First Dáil Éireann

Do you as Minister of Finance

still acknowledge the sovereignty of
Dail Eireann as in the 1916 Proclamation
and implemented and vested in
Vaughans Hotel, 29 Parnell Square Dublin
on the 21st of January 1919, and the sovereignty
of the Thirty two Counties (32) and the
sovereignty of the sovereign Irish
People
