Policy for Local Government

Definition:

Local Government is defined herein as the Local Authority responsible for public administration within each County and/or Province in the Sovereign Republic of Eire.

Principle 1: Public Office Is a Public Trust of the People of Ireland

The Office Holder in a Local Authority entrusted with Public Power by the People of Ireland through a Popular Vote; holds this power in trust to be used only for the benefit of the County and for the People of Ireland particular to the County. The Office Holder must not abuse the Public Power for the benefit of themselves or of a few; and the Officer Holder must never conduct their own affairs so as to infringe on the public interest. The Office Holder must serve the position with the highest integrity.

All official conduct of Local Authority employees elected and otherwise should be guided by this Paramount Principle of Public Office.

Principle 2: Beneficiaries, Trustees & Settlor

Beneficiaries: The People of Ireland of relevant County.

Trustees: Public Office Holder, Administrators, Directors, Councillors

Settlor: Directly Elected Executive Mayor under Seal for the People of Ireland.

Principle 3: The Corporation

The/any Corporation used to conduct commerce on behalf of a Public Trust Local Authority will operate by way of a licence granted under Seal by the Directly Elected Executive Mayor for the People of Ireland Trust.

The Share Capital of the/any Corporation used to conduct commerce will be held in trust for the People of Ireland.

Principle 4: County Courts

Local Authorities can adopt and or uphold bye-laws through the County Courts, as provided for under licence by the Constitution of the Sovereign Dáil Éireann Courts.

Principle 5: Local Environment

The Local Environment of said County including all lands and waterways will be subject to environmental bye-laws put in place to protect native biodiversity of the Sovereign Nation State of Éire and may be adopted and/or enforced as necessary through the County Courts as provided for under licence by the Constitution of the Sovereign Dáil Éireann Courts.

Principle 6: County Code and Oath of Honour

Each County will write, adopt and maintain an agreed Code of Honour to be enshrined into their County Deed of Public Trust. Each resident may swear an oath of honour to promote positive community values in their County as an active citizen.

Principle 7: Accountability

Each active citizen will be held accountable as an active citizen, passive citizens such as children, mothers and elderly will be protected by special Policy and Office Holders will be held to high accountability as an office holder and can face higher penalties for breaches in public trust while in position as an Office Holder.

Principle 8: Transparency

A Local Authority must publish a full accounting each year in the public domain.

Principle 9: Inclusion

Inclusivity will be promoted through the Public Participation Network. The PPN will encapsulate all of the Community Councils and other Local Groups that seek to promote the public good within their communities.

Principle 10: Public Services

Local Government will operate services which function optimally in public hands. Private Enterprises who provide services that are essential to basic physiological needs of people and the natural environment will need to operate by way of licence.

Principle 11: Taxation

Taxation will be levied against negative externalities such as pollution, fines for breaches of conduct, economic stagnation / hoarding, etc.

Principle 12: Private Property / Planning System

The Planning system oversees and regulates and assists private ownership, management and development of land in line with Local and National Policy.

Principle 13: Religious / Spiritual

Each County will respect peoples religious and spiritual liberties as long as practices do not breach the laws of the land.
