Meeting opens 16:22

1. Chair, John-Declan Flanagan cedes the chair to Vice-Chair Brendan K

Brendan prefaces a proposal to the Supreme Council that there were consequences for using, pushing or selling drugs in the old Republican movements. That cocaine and heroin use had ruined too many lives and families and that anyone on the Supreme Council using or selling drugs should be removed immediately and not allowed to return. John C. tells the Council openly that he had taken cocaine previously on social occasions before being co-opted to the Supreme Council of the IRB. He recognises the importance and impact of his behaviour on the Council and the organisation as a whole. The Supreme Council all sign the Code of Conduct.

Niall M, Eamonn C, Kevin T, Barra, d R, Melissa K and Colm G all speak of their desire to resolve the matter between the two parties. Some spoke from personal experiences of addiction and all agreed that the council takes a zero-tolerance approach. All agreed that the behaviour of John C was young and foolish but his behaviour since his appointment was evidence of reform and an earnest dedication to his peers and the cause.

Brendan K absents himself and John F reads aloud the Code of Conduct for the Supreme Council.

2. É-I-R-E

The domain name and website are now secure for e-i-r-e.ie where people can claim their interest in their dwelling/property. The website will have tabs for each county. This places their interest above 'legal', the lowest level of interest. It is proposed that an administration fee of €55 be charged and a fee of €555 be charged for the claim itself. It was further

proposed that in the interest of expediency and travel to the I.R.B. Head Office in Lisacannon, Clare and with the unanimous agreement of the Supreme Council, the 3 signatures of the remaining executive (Brendan K, Kevin T and Howard H) in digital format be applied to the Deeds as required with the Chair, John Flanagan applying his wet ink signature to the documents.

As Irish is the language of the Sovereign Dáil Éireann Courts, the Deeds will be in Irish (as Gaeilge).

3. I.R.B. travel licence

On inspection, it was found that the 'tax disc' displayed on Irish cars is actually a 'travel licence' with implied consent that the person using the conveyance is a 'drive' and that they are operating a 'motor propelled vehicle'. Both these terms are commercial in nature. When people register their car or van they transfer ownership to the registered authority.

The I.R.B. has created a 'travel licence' for sovereign citizens to place on their conveyance which is linked to their passport (freedom to travel).

4. John Flanagan vs Tony Holohan and Norma Foley Chief State Solicitor's Response

Having informed the CSSO that he would seek a judgment *in absentia* for the above case, the CSSO has responded to the Chair setting out terms of engagement. John has informed the CSSO that he is seeking approval from the Registrar of the Sovereign Dáil Éireann Courts to have this matter heard there and also to expand Proceedings and co-join additional Plaintiffs. The matters involve trespass, theft and treason.

As the proceedings expand, the Secretaries for Housing and Education were called upon to gather evidence for their cases along with Melissa K and any other organisation or individual who have been holding the State to account for their handling of the Irish territory, resources and people. What relief are we seeking and what methods of enforcement are available to us?

5. Award/recognition for an individual's outstanding contribution to sovereignty

A post-Civil War gold medal (1921-1971) in recognition of survivors was passed around. The question was posed; how can we adapt this to recognise those who make outstanding contributions to the cause of Irish sovereignty?

6. PaddyWagon

PaddyWagon is seeking a licence to operate a restaurant and museum in the P. J. Holland centre. This was granted unanimously by the council.

7. Attaching the authority.

It has been noticed through various social media attacks that information that the Brotherhood has put out cannot be challenged so the opposition has called into question the authority of Billy McGuire and Michale Collins. However, the lineage for the authority can be traced from 1916 to the present day.

General Secretary, Howard Hughes also signed the printed territorial claims from 1963 to 2023 with President, Billy McGuire.
